|We hope you all enjoyed some downtime over Winter Break with your family and friends! We are thankful for longer days, and warmer | weather on the horizon! Our teachers attended Teachers Convention over the break, and took in sessions to improve their instructional practice, and learn new ways to support our learners.

On March 1, 2022 the government lifted many restrictions for us in schools; which we are so thankful for! We wanted to reach out and clarify some of the new changes.

- We have removed class cohorting- students may now interact with each other in the classroom environment, and many of the teachers have rearranged their classrooms to accommodate and allow groups of students to sit together!
- Masks are used only by those who wish to wear them. Our staff and students will respect anyone who chooses to wear a mask.
- Sanitizing continues to be available for those who would like to use it, but it is not forced when entering our building and leaving classrooms.
- We are moving our Parent Teacher Interviews to a choice of in-person, online, or a phone call. They will be held on March 24th from 3:15pm until 8:00pm. We will be sending out more information in the coming weeks.
- Staggered entries and exits of our classes are now in effect. Our students come and go into the building with the bells.
- We are welcoming back the use of volunteers, as long as both the child welfare check and criminal record check have been completed. If you'd like to get these forms done, please ask your child's teacher for a volunteering package and we will send one home.

There will be some routines that will remain in use this year for operational reasons or to help those adapt to our return to life without restrictions.

- During the day if students need to be picked up or dropped off please call the office, or come in our staff will assist you.
- We are keeping our zoned recesses in effect. We have found a decrease in social conflict between grades, as well, our students have the opportunity to play on the equipment safely with less students.

We are excited as we move forward with planning and organizing some events and routines that have not taken place in the last two years due to the Covid-19 pandemic. In the coming months we look forward to bringing back the following:

- Our schools will now be open for community use please contact the school if you would like to rent our gymnasium for a community event or group.
- We will be planning our Panther Paw Award assemblies to be in person! We plan to have this resume at the end of March.
- We are excited to have our students interacting with other classes in the same grade. Our teachers are busy planning graded activities.
- Field trips tied to the curriculum are being planned for student engagement!
- We are also beginning to plan volunteer opportunities for parents to support our students and be more connected within our school.



SUPPORTING STUDENTS
