#### FROM THE DESK OF THE PRINCIPAL

It is hard to believe that we are already one month into our 2022/2023 school year. This past month has been filled with new experiences for all of our students as they became comfortable with their new teacher, classmates and routines. All of our students have excelled at getting back into 'school mode'. Walking through the classrooms at PES is always filled with students engaged in their learning, putting such great effort into their work, and having many points of pride in what they have accomplished.

As many of you know, Mrs. Lisa Baird, our school principal, is expecting a new baby and was planning to leave us this fall. Mrs. Baird has officially gone on her maternity leave and is awaiting the arrival of this new addition to their family. We wish Mrs. Baird all the best and will update the students when the newest member of the Baird family arrives. With Mrs. Baird leaving, we have welcomed Mr. Mark Crawford into our school to be our acting Vice-Principal. Mr. Crawford has spent many years in Penhold schools, having previous time spent at both Penhold Elementary School and Penhold Crossing Secondary School, and has thoroughly enjoyed his first days with us.

September was a busy month for our whole school. We kicked off the year with a whole school assembly introducing our new staff, our old staff, and setting the stage on what the students can expect for this up and coming year. Our annual Terry Fox run kicked off at Penhold Crossing Secondary School. Penhold students from grades 4 - 12 were together to be reminded of why this run occurs, the lessons on perseverance that come from it, and teaching students the importance to come together as a community to support worthy causes. On Sept 30th, our students honoured the many Indigenous students and families on Orange Shirt Day who suffered because of Residential Schools in Canada. Our students made feathers to decorate our fence with and share what they feel school should be, and should have been for those students. While Orange Shirt day is just one day in our school year, our classrooms teach about the importance of reconciliation throughout the year. Staff had their first Professional Development Day of the year. We took time on this day to focus on where are students are in their numeracy skills. Teachers dug into data to determine areas of numeracy that our student are excelling at and struggling with and made plans on how to address those areas. Teachers have already started to finish up units of study in their classes and have begun to assess on these units.

October will surely be just as busy as September was. Our first student of the month assembly occurred on Monday where we introduced some new awards to PES. We have our school photo day on Oct 7th, our fall book fair from Oct 18th to 20th, and our fall parent teacher interviews on the evening of Oct 20th. Our school highly values strong relationships between school and families. These parent teacher interview meetings are a critical part to ensuring success for our students and we cannot wait to see you all in person.

#### **PES Monthly Awards**

At PES we have a monthly assembly where we honour students who are being recognized for displaying our monthly theme. Our monthly themes are posted on our website and are in all students agendas. Theme for October is Compassion.

### 2022/2023 Swimming

Swimming dates for 2022/2023 school year begins this month. The fees for swimming classes have gone up to \$80 this year, which parents will find as quite an increase from last year. The increase in cost comes from the increase that has occurred in bussing.

Swimming is an extra experience that we provide to students that compliments our Phys Ed programming. Since it is extra however, if families are unable to pay the cost of this, students will not be able to participate in swimming lessons.

Parents will notice that this fee to swimming, whether they start in October or later in the year, are being added to their accounts this month. This is to give families the opportunity to pay for their swimming lessons in partial payments. Field trip forms for swimming are also being sent out at the same time. Finally, the Innisfail Pool has changed how they are gathering the students previous swimming experience. They have a Google Form that our teachers will send out to parents closer to their classes swimming dates.

#### Halloween 2022

On Monday, Oct 31, we will be having activities in the day to celebrate Halloween. Teachers will be sharing with parents and students ahead of time what can be expected in your child's classroom.

For costumes, we ask that students do not bring toy weapons or wear face masks as these items can affect the learning that will still be happening that day. As well, these items can be scary for some of our younger students.

#### **Halloween Dance**

We are excited to get back to some pre-Covid activities, and the annual Halloween dance is one of them.

PowerSchool does have an app (PowerSchool Mobile) that can be downloaded from the Apple App Store or Google Play Store to allow for easier navigation on handheld devices. Your username and password are the same as if you log into our parent portal. Our district code is BPWW.

If your child is in grade 4, their marks are not shared through this online platform but through classroom communication.
